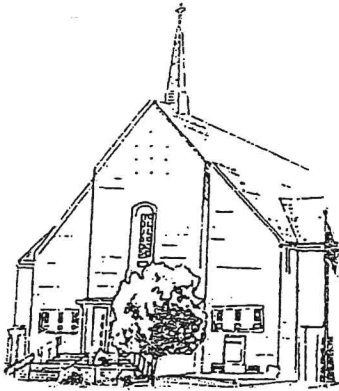

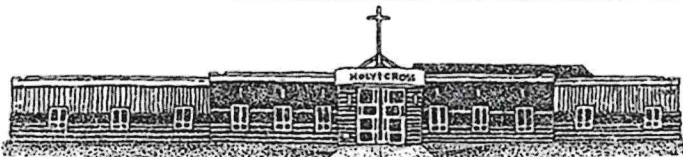

Clarification and additional resources about birth control

Two weeks ago, I preached on the topic of birth control, looking especially at what the Second Vatican Council taught on this topic. A parishioner contacted me for a clarification, and I thought it would be good to share this with the whole community.

As I had stated during my homily, the use of birth control / contraception is a grave moral evil when used to intentionally prevent a pregnancy because it violates the purpose of the marital act as being for the dual purpose of union and procreation.

However, when birth control is prescribed for a separate medical condition, it is not automatically sinful. Many young women are prescribed birth control to alleviate abnormal symptoms related to their cycle. When birth control is used for this purpose, it is not sinful.

It becomes more difficult, however, when a young woman gets married and continues taking birth control. If it is still necessary for her to take it for medical reasons, it may be permissible and not sinful. However, its medical use cannot be used as a prolonged excuse to not be open to the conception of a child. Also, when birth control is used for other medical reasons, it still can have the effect of being an abortifacient in a case of breakthrough ovulation when a conception may actually occur and yet not be able to implant in the womb. In this case, the woman may not be culpable for this, but this situation is certainly best avoided if at all possible.

I realize I have no formal medical training, and what I offer here is not medical advice but only information. I have learned a lot about good alternatives to needing to be on birth control to control cycle related issues. When birth control is prescribed to alleviate abnormal symptoms, it may make the symptoms go away, but it does not actually address the underlying issue that caused the symptoms in the first place. That can cause the symptoms to worsen over time. Thankfully there are many doctors who are now specializing in this area and are able to help women identify their underlying issues and assist in healing them so that the symptoms go away on their own, rather than needing to medicate it.

A significant resource on this topic is the *Creighton Model FertilityCare System* and their corresponding medical protocol, *NaProTechnology* (short for *Natural Procreative Technology*). This is a very advanced scientifically based women's health system that has done great work in assisting women with treating the root cause of their health problems. Women can learn to chart biomarkers in the Creighton chart that guides their medical care from doctors who are trained in NaProTechnology. Finally, I would encourage everyone to learn more about the Church's teaching on birth control and why it is wrong. Most Catholics not only will never hear their pastor preach about this topic, but they also don't do their own study of the topic. 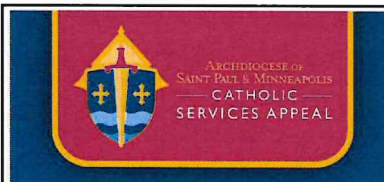

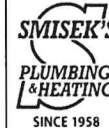
