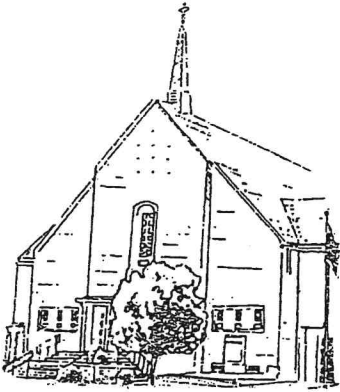

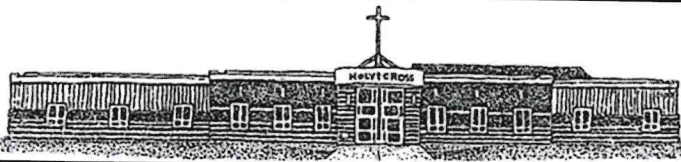

[Human dignity demands] *"better protection to the rights of the person in public life. These include the right freely to meet and form associations, the right to express one's own opinion and to profess one's religion both publicly and privately. ... [and also] those political systems prevailing in some parts of the world are to be reprovved which hamper civic or religious freedom."* (73)

"It is inhuman for public authority to fall back on dictatorial systems or totalitarian methods which violate the rights of the person or social groups." (75)

"The Church praises and esteems the work of those who for the good of men devote themselves to the service of the state and take on the burdens of this office." (75)

"The relationship between the political community and the Church..." (76) *"The Church, by reason of her role and competence, is not identified in any way with the political community nor bound to any political system. She is at once a sign and a safeguard of the transcendent character of the human person."*

"The Church, for her part, founded on the love of the Redeemer, contributes toward the reign of justice and charity within the borders of a nation and between nations. By preaching the truths of the Gospel, and bringing to bear on all fields of human endeavor the light of her doctrine and of a Christian witness, she respects and fosters the political freedom and responsibility of citizens."

"at all times and in all places, the Church should have true freedom to preach the faith, to teach her social doctrine, to exercise her role freely among men, and also to pass moral judgment in those matters which regard public order when the fundamental rights of a person or the salvation of souls require it. ... While faithfully adhering to the Gospel and fulfilling her mission to the world, the Church, whose duty it is to foster and elevate all that is found to be true, good and beautiful in the human community, strengthens peace among men for the glory of God."

"Peace is likewise the fruit of love, which goes beyond what justice can provide."

[Regarding war.] *"governments cannot be denied the right to legitimate defense once every means of peaceful settlement has been exhausted. State authorities and others who share public responsibility have the duty to conduct such grave matters soberly and to protect the welfare of the people entrusted to their care. But it is one thing to undertake military action for the just defense of the people, and something else again to seek the subjugation of other nations. Nor, by the same token, does the mere fact that war has unhappily begun mean that all is fair between the warring parties."* (79)

"The horror and perversity of war is immensely magnified by the addition of scientific weapons. For acts of war involving these weapons can inflict massive and indiscriminate destruction, thus going far beyond the bounds of legitimate defense." (80)

[Regarding poverty.] *"the greater part of the world is still suffering from so much poverty that it is as if Christ Himself were crying out in these poor to beg the charity of the disciples. Do not let men, then, be scandalized because some countries with a majority of citizens who are counted as Christians have an abundance of wealth, whereas others are deprived of the necessities of life and are tormented with hunger, disease, and every kind of misery. The spirit of poverty and charity are the glory and witness of the Church of Christ."*

Daily Mass Seating Change

Beginning last week, for daily Masses, I ask that everyone sit in the front of church. To help facilitate this, the back pews in church will be roped off. The reason for this is that when we celebrate Mass we are united as a community of believers. However, too often, it seems more like a few scattered individuals who sit as far away from each other and the altar as they can. This has made it very difficult for me to celebrate daily Masses well. Therefore, we are going to try out having everyone sit together in the front of church.

Many churches use a smaller chapel for daily Mass because of this exact situation, however, since we do not have a smaller chapel, we will just make the church smaller so that we can be more together as a community of faith.

History of the Lonsdale Rosary Makers

A group of Immaculate Conception Women began meeting at the Villages to make Rosaries. Many residents were able to help make Rosaries and supplies could be stored at the facility. COVID changed this when meeting in person was not possible. Shirley Trcka was one of the originals and the organizer. When she wanted to step away, Joan Trnka, decided to learn the ropes and continue the Rosary Makers meeting at the Civic Center (Parish Hall), since most of the residents that helped had passed. Today, we have an active group of about 12, meeting on Wednesdays from 1-4. Since, Joan took over in 2020, our records show we have sent out 41,870 Rosaries to Africa, put some out in the back of church for anyone to take, provided Rosaries for 1st Communicants, and gifts for special occasions (Examples, 50th Wedding anniversary, In Memory of someone who had passed). Expenses had been covered by the group for quite some time. We are thankful to the FCSLA and Lonsdale Knights of Columbus for some generous donations. Shipping is our biggest expense with \$28 a box. This group has been great for many of us who are retired and looking to stay connected with people, as well as making Rosaries. We are thankful for the use of the Parish Hall. Pastor's column continued...

Those Christians are to be praised and supported, therefore, who volunteer their services to help other men and nations. Indeed, it is the duty of the whole People of God, following the word and example of the bishops, to alleviate as far as they are able the sufferings of the modern age. They should do this too, as was the ancient custom in the Church, out of the substance of their goods, and not only out of what is superfluous." (88)

[Conclusion of the document.] *"We have relied on the word of God and the spirit of the Gospel. Hence we entertain the hope that many of our proposals will prove to be of substantial benefit to everyone, especially after they have been adapted to individual nations and mentalities by the faithful, under the guidance of their pastors." (91)*

"the bonds which unite the faithful are mightier than anything dividing them. Hence, let there be unity in what is necessary; freedom in what is unsettled, and charity in any case." (92)

"Mindful of the Lord's saying: "by this will all men know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another" (John 13:35), Christians cannot yearn for anything more ardently than to serve the men of the modern world with mounting generosity and success. Therefore, by holding faithfully to the Gospel and benefiting from its resources, by joining with every man who loves and practices justice, Christians have shouldered a gigantic task for fulfillment in this world, a task concerning which they must give a reckoning to Him who will judge every man on the last of days." (93)

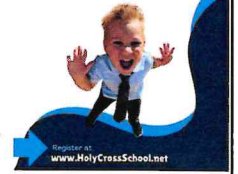

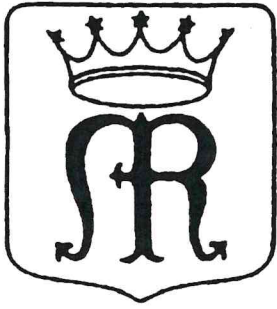
