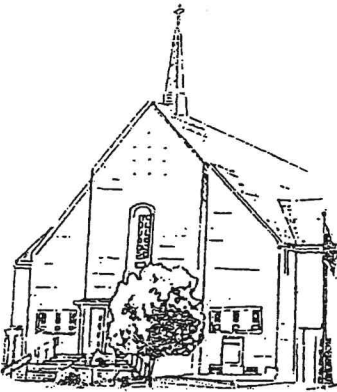

### Vatican II Final Thoughts

I began my preaching and bulletin series on the Second Vatican Council in September 2023. Now, 17 months later, we have finally concluded the series by looking at all 16 documents of Vatican II. As we close this series, I want to offer a few final thoughts.

#### Summary:

The Second Vatican Council, which met during the years 1962 to 1965, was a gathering of the Pope and the bishops of the world (about 2,450 bishops attended). Other attendees included various priests, religious, and lay people who had an expertise to offer in theology or some other area. The Council was called for by Pope John XXIII (23<sup>rd</sup>), but since he died in 1963, the Council was concluded by the next pope, Pope Paul VI.

The reason Vatican II was called was a desire to address contemporary challenges and to renew the mission of the Church in the modern world. In his opening address to the Council, Pope John XXIII said he hoped the Council would "muster the Church's best energies and studies with all earnestness how to have the message of salvation more readily welcomed by men." Additionally, "The present council is a special, worldwide manifestation by the Church of her teaching office, exercised in taking account of the errors, needs, and opportunities of our day."

Of the 16 documents of Vatican II, 4 are the most important:

- Sacrosanctum Concilium – The Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy
- Lumen Gentium – The Dogmatic Constitution on the Church
- Dei Verbum – The Dogmatic Constitution on Divine Revelation
- Gaudium et Spes – The Pastoral Constitution on the Church in the Modern World

Some of the most important ideas or quotes to come out of the Council were regarding the liturgy. Here are some significant quotes from the document on the liturgy, Sacrosanctum Concilium:

- "Every liturgical celebration, because it is an action of Christ the priest and of His Body which is the Church, is a sacred action surpassing all others; no other action of the Church can equal its efficacy by the same title and to the same degree." – (SC, 7)
- "The liturgy is the summit toward which the activity of the Church is directed; at the same time it is the font from which all her power flows." – (SC, 10)
- "Mother Church earnestly desires that all the faithful should be led to that fully conscious, and active participation in liturgical celebrations which is demanded by the very nature of the liturgy." – (SC, 14)
- "Particular law remaining in force, the use of the Latin language is to be preserved in the Latin rites. But since the use of the mother tongue [eg. English], whether in the Mass, the administration of the sacraments, or other parts of the liturgy, frequently may be of great advantage to the people, the limits of its employment may be extended." – (SC, 36)

Other important quotes from the Council documents:

- "The universal call to holiness", i.e. everyone is called to holiness – (Lumen Gentium, 39)
- "[The Church] exists in order to evangelize, that is to say, in order to preach and teach, to be the channel of the gift of grace, to reconcile sinners with God, and to perpetuate Christ's sacrifice in the Mass, which is the memorial of His death and glorious resurrection." – (Evangelii Nuntiandi, 14)
- "The human person has a right to religious freedom...[which] has its foundation in the very dignity of the human person." – (Dignitatis Humanae, 2)
- "The truth is that only in the mystery of the incarnate Word does the mystery of man take on light. For Adam, the first man, was a figure of Him Who was to come, namely Christ the Lord. Christ, the final Adam, by the revelation of the mystery of the Father and His love, fully reveals man to man himself and makes his supreme calling clear." – (Gaudium et Spes, 22)
- "Man, who is the only creature on earth which God willed for itself, cannot fully find himself except through a sincere gift of himself." – (Gaudium et Spes, 24)
- "This split between the faith which many profess and their daily lives deserves to be counted among the more serious errors of our age." – (Gaudium et Spes, 43)

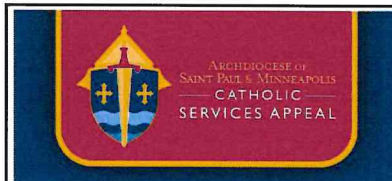

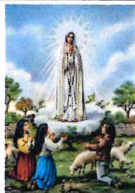
