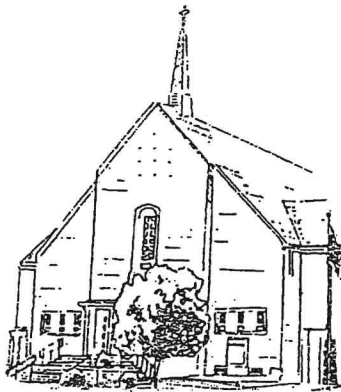

## March 9, 2025

1st Sunday of Lent

*"You shall worship the Lord, your God, and him alone shall you serve."*

Shrove Tuesday and Mardi Gras

The day before Ash Wednesday is known as Shrove Tuesday or Mardi Gras.

The term Mardi Gras is probably much more familiar to us, but the term Shrove Tuesday is actually more important from a religious perspective.

The term Mardi Gras is French for "Fat Tuesday". This term refers to the feasting and celebrating that happens before Lent begins. Traditionally, people would not eat rich foods during Lent, so in the attempt to eat them up before Lent began, they referred to the day before Ash Wednesday as "Fat Tuesday". In particular, animal fat was often not consumed during Lent, so you had to eat up the fat before Lent began, and thus: Fat Tuesday.

Unfortunately, Mardi Gras has taken on a very secular significance, and often is celebrated more as a holiday of debauchery than it is of simply eating up the rich foods in our house.

The term Shrove Tuesday comes from an Old English word "Shrive" which Merriam-Websters Dictionary online defines as: "to administer the sacrament of reconciliation, or to free from guilt".

So, to "shrive" is to confess our sins and receive absolution. Then we can say we "shrove", or have been "shriven".

The idea is that people used to go to confession before Lent even started so that they would be in a good place spiritually to celebrate well this season of prayer and penance. Thus, Shrove Tuesday was a reminder to be shriven before Lent began.

In our modern practice it is more common to go to confession during Lent, rather than before, but either way, it has always been an important practice of the Church to be sure to get to the sacrament of confession before or during Lent.

In summary, the celebration of Mardi Gras and Shrove Tuesday is a reminder to us of the important transition we make from ordinary life into the season of Lent. The 40 days of Lent should have a distinctly different feeling than the ordinary days before Lent, and especially from the great feast of Easter following Lent.

I encourage you, if you haven't already, to choose some special disciplines for Lent to focus on the categories of Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving.

And if you have not yet been shriven, be sure and do so before Easter!

## Capital Campaign Projects Update

The boiler project is basically wrapped up. This consisted of the complete removal and replacement of the old steam boiler with a new hot water boiler, and also the installation of forced air furnaces to heat the church basement.

I am deeply grateful to Dave and Judy Stepka, Joe Pavek, and Jason Crow for their dedication to this project. They were at church two nights a week for several months in a row to complete the project. The gift of their time and expertise has a tremendous impact on the campaign, not only by getting the project done, but in helping save us a lot of money. I know they didn't do this for recognition but because they love our church and want to preserve the legacy of faith at Immaculate Conception, but they do deserve our thanks.

Here is a financial update on the boiler project: At the start of the campaign, we had budgeted \$200,000 for the boiler and HVAC project. However, we were able to complete the project significantly under budget. We had \$75,791 in donated materials. And our parish expenses came to \$93,667.

We are now working on getting final plans and bids for the bathroom remodel project. However, the plumbing permit may take 12 or more weeks, so we may not be able to begin work until sometime in May or June. We also anticipate tuckpointing the outside brick will start sometime this spring or summer. Additionally, we are also considering doing a more extensive remodel of the church kitchen, so we are looking into costs for that option.

Thank you for your continued support of the campaign. It is exciting to see what we have accomplished so far and the additional projects that will be done soon!

We are excited to bring the coloring contest back this Lent. We will be pulling pages from a Holy Heroes coloring book about Saint Peter.

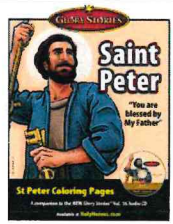
Starting the first Sunday of Lent for 6 weeks, we will be printing a page from this coloring book, and have it ready for pickup in the back of church.

The journey He endured to Calvary is divided into fourteen stations from the time He was condemned to his burial. Meditating on the Stations helps us enter into Christ's passion and reminds us of what He did for us out of pure love.

Embrace the Cross this Lent, that Christ has so willingly carried for you. Walk with him. Be the "Simon" and help Him, the "Veronica" and wipe His face, the "disciple" that helped lay His body into Our Lady's arms. So that on Easter morning, you too can genuinely rejoice knowing Jesus came because He loves you!

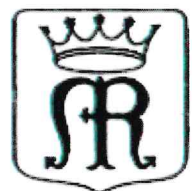
