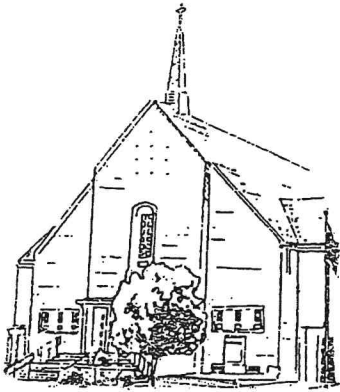

Deliverance Prayers for use by the Laity

Last week in my homily I mentioned "minor exorcism" or "deliverance prayers" that can be said by the laity to assist in our battle against Satan and his temptations. Here are some simple prayers that can be said for protection against the devil and temptations:

- "In Jesus name, I command you to leave me and stop tempting me."
- Or to name and renounce the sin you are tempted to commit, and any demons that may be attached to that sin: "In Jesus' name, I renounce the spirit of (lust, etc.) and I command it to leave me, and to go to the foot of the Cross."
- Say the name Jesus repeatedly: "Jesus, Jesus, Jesus". Or, "Jesus, help me."
- Pray the St. Michael prayer.

For the rest of my article today, I'd like to share some quotes and prayers from a great little book on this topic called "Deliverance Prayers for use by the Laity" by Fr. Chad Ripperger.

"Throughout the history of the Church, various saints and even the Church herself have provided the laity with means of combating the demons that afflict their lives. We are thinking, for example, of the short form of the Prayer to Saint Michael, or even the recommendation for the laity when they are tempted to say to Satan, 'In the name of Jesus Christ, be gone!'"

"The need for the requisite authority from which the power to drive the demons out is necessary. ... It is for this reason that this book has been put together, viz. to provide the laity with prayers that they can use licitly and without retaliation. ... such as commanding the demons to leave their own bodies or those over whom they have authority by the natural law (such as their children or wife, etc.)."

"Lastly, we cannot recommend the constant petition and perfect confidence in Our Lady enough. For She who has perfect coercive power over demons can protect us from any diabolic attack of any kind. In fine, if we remain under Her mantle, no demon will dare to approach us. Yet this only comes when we never offend Her Son and we have perfect confidence in Her. ... The second reason to pray to Our Lady of Sorrows is because of the promises made by Her to St. Bridget of Sweden: 'I will defend them in their spiritual battles with the infernal enemy and I will protect them at every instant of their lives.' Ultimately we are powerless to protect ourselves in the spiritual warfare. Only Christ can protect us and those whom Christ has commissioned to protect us, among whom Our Lady stands above the rest. So it is in Her that we place our confidence; may She protect all who use this book."

Deliverance prayers

"In His Name and by the power of His Cross and Blood, I ask Jesus to bind any evil spirits, forces and powers of the earth, air, fire, or water, of the netherworld and the satanic forces of nature. By the power of the Holy Spirit and by His authority, I ask Jesus Christ to break any curses, hexes, or spells and send them back to where they came from, if it be His Holy Will. I beseech Thee Lord Jesus to protect us by pouring Thy Precious Blood on us (my family, etc.), which Thou hast shed for us and I ask Thee to command that any departing spirits leave quietly, without disturbance, and go straight to Thy Cross to dispose of as Thou sees fit. I ask Thee to bind any demonic interaction, interplay or communications. I place N. (person, place or thing) under the protection of the Blood of Jesus Christ which He shed for us. Amen."

"Lord Jesus Christ, in Thy Name, I ask Thee to bind and silence all powers and forces that do not accept Thee as Lord and King, in the air, in the water, in the ground, the netherworld and nature and the spiritual world. I ask Thee to bind all demonic action and demonic communication. Lord, seal this whole place, all of us here and all our intentions in the Precious Blood of Jesus Christ. Mary, we ask thee to surround us with thy mantle of protection and crush Satan's power in our lives. Saint Michael the Archangel, we ask thee and all our Guardian Angels to defend us in battle against Satan and the powers of darkness. Amen."

We are excited to bring the coloring contest back this Lent. We will be pulling pages from a Holy Heroes coloring book about Saint Peter.

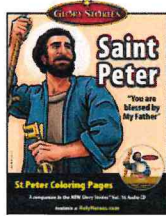
Starting the first Sunday of Lent and continuing through Lent, we will be printing a page from this coloring book, and have it ready for pickup in the back of church.

The Stations of the Cross, also known as The Way of the Cross, is a way to meditate on Christ's sacrificial love for us. This devotion has been long encouraged, especially during Lent, for personal and communal prayer, since the early Church.

It is a custom of many Christians to travel to the Holy Land and walk the Way of the Cross where the Son of God did so many years ago. But not everyone can make a pilgrimage like that, but we all can walk the Way of the Cross with Jesus in our own prayer life.

The journey He endured to Calvary is divided into fourteen stations from the time He was condemned to his burial. Meditating on the Stations helps us enter into Christ's passion and reminds us of what He did for us out of pure love.

Embrace the Cross this Lent, that Christ has so willingly carried for you. Walk with him. Be the "Simon" and help Him, the "Veronica" and wipe His face, the "disciple" that helped lay His body into Our Lady's arms. So that on Easter morning, you too can genuinely rejoice knowing Jesus came because He loves you!
