

2nd Sunday of Advent

*"Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths:
all flesh shall see the salvation of God."*

Mary in Scripture

This Monday, December 8th, we celebrate our feast day: The solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

For my pastor's column today, I'd like to focus on scripture passages that speak about Mary.

Did you know that the Hail Mary prayer comes directly from scripture?

- **Luke 1:28** – And [the angel Gabriel] came to her and said, "Hail, full of grace, the Lord is with you!"
• *i.e. Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee*
- **Luke 1:41-42** – And when Elizabeth heard the greeting of Mary, the babe leaped in her womb; and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit and she exclaimed with a loud cry, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb!"
• *i.e. Blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus.*
- **Luke 1:43** – And why is this granted me, that the mother of my Lord should come to me?
• *i.e. Holy Mary, Mother of God*
- **James 5:16** – Therefore confess your sins to one another, and pray for one another, that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous man has great power in its effects.
• *i.e. Pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.*

At both the start of the bible (Genesis) and the end of the bible (Revelation), we hear about the woman, her offspring, and the serpent. This is a fascinating prophecy that God made at the very beginning that one day Satan (the serpent) would be defeated, and that this would happen through the woman and her seed (i.e. Mary and Jesus).

- **Genesis 3:15** – I will put enmity between you [i.e. the serpent] and the woman, and between your seed and her seed; he shall bruise your head, and you shall bruise his heel."
- **Revelation 12:1-12** – A great sign appeared in the sky, a woman clothed with the sun, with the moon under her feet, and on her head a crown of twelve stars. She was with child and wailed aloud in pain as she labored to give birth. Then another sign appeared in the sky; it was a huge red dragon, with seven heads and ten horns, and on its heads were seven diadems. ... She gave birth to a son, a male child, destined to rule all the nations with an iron rod. ... The huge dragon, the ancient serpent, who is called the Devil and Satan, who deceived the whole world, was thrown down to earth, and its angels were thrown down with it. Then I heard a loud voice in heaven say: "Now have salvation and power come, and the kingdom of our God and the authority of his Anointed. For the accuser of our brothers is cast out, who accuses them before our God day and night. They conquered him by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of their testimony; love for life did not deter them from death.

The story of the Wedding at Cana is another important passage because it is the first of Jesus' public miracles, and he does this miracle at the prompting of his mother, Mary. This is a sign of how Mary intercedes for us as well.

- **John 2** – (Read verses 1-11)

Another important Marian passage is as Jesus is dying on the cross. One of the final things he does is give his Blessed Mother to us as our Mother. The Gospel story uses the term "the beloved disciple" to refer to St. John, but all of us as beloved disciples of Jesus can see ourselves as being given to Mary and she to us.

- **John 19:25-27** – Standing by the cross of Jesus were his mother, and his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene. When Jesus saw his mother, and the disciple whom he loved standing near, he said to his mother, "Woman, behold, your son!" Then he said to the disciple, "Behold, your mother!" And from that hour the disciple took her to his own home.




