

Last weekend, I discussed what scripture and the tradition of the Church say about the antichrist. I wanted to follow that up this weekend and share some scripture passages and other material for you if you would like to learn more.

Archbishop Fulton Sheen wrote in 1951:

- "The Antichrist will not be so called; otherwise he would have no followers... he will come disguised as the Great Humanitarian; he will talk peace, prosperity and plenty not as means to lead us to God, but as ends in themselves... He will tempt Christians with the same three temptations with which he tempted Christ... He will have one great secret which he will tell to no one: he will not believe in God. Because his religion will be brotherhood without the fatherhood of God, he will deceive even the elect. He will set up a counterchurch... It will have all the notes and characteristics of the Church, but in reverse and emptied of its divine content. It will be a mystical body of the Antichrist that will in all externals resemble the mystical body of Christ."

Stay close to Christ through prayer and the sacraments!



END OF YEAR PLANNED GIVING



When you make a planned gift that supports The Church of the Immaculate Conception, you ensure that the mission of our parish is fulfilled. Your planned gift has a lasting impact on our Church and on our world.

Gift of Stock

A gift of stock to the Church of the Immaculate Conception can provide you with DOUBLE TAX BENEFITS. First, you may be able to claim a charitable donation in the amount of the market value of the stock (original cost plus any increase in value) on the date the gift is made to the Church of the Immaculate Conception. Second, you avoid paying taxes on the appreciated value of the donated stock.

IRA Direct Transfer

If you make a direct transfer from your IRA to the Church of the Immaculate Conception, this won't increase your adjusted gross income as this transfer is not actually distributed to you. This is called a Qualified Charitable Distribution. This option is particularly beneficial if you don't itemize deductions on your tax return.

Matching Donation

Many employers sponsor matching gift programs and will match any charitable contributions made by their employees to a qualified charitable organization. Most employers will match to the school and some employers will match to the Church as well. This is a way to double your gift to benefit the Church of the Immaculate Conception.

A special note from the Cemetery Board regarding Calvary Cemetery

PAST HISTORY

In 1986, Otto and Darlene and family donated 10 acres of their land to expand the cemetery. They realized that in the future more space will be needed for expansion.

Later, Tim and Debbie Rud donated their time and equipment to the landscaping of the new part.

When we had some water problems at the cemetery, Kevin Malecha of Common Grounds tiled the wet spots.

There were problems with trees which were in bad shape and ready to fall down on the cemetery stones or the altar. We took them all down. If by chance they would have fallen on the stones or altar it would have damaged them. Later we found out that if the trees had fallen on the altar statues that just one statue would cost \$10,000 to repair.

Just this fall, we had Prior Lake Black Top re-pave the road in the cemetery, which was greatly needed. They did a super job, and it will last a long time. We want to thank Tim Rud for all his help and guidance in that project.

We had Kevin and Jim Kodada take down two pillars and two short walls which were damaged.

We had Don and Mary Malecha Landscapes donate the black dirt around the new tar road.

We also had Joe Simon donate black dirt to put in our low spots and on top of the new grave sites. And helping with their equipment in repairing the tile line with dirt.

FUTURE PROJECTS

Projects that we need to address in the future are the altar at the cemetery and wall need attention.

Fixing the cracks in the road going up the hill to the cemetery.
