



Capital Campaign Update

We have now completed the second year of our 3-year capital campaign. I am very pleased with the progress we have made and the renovations that have been completed.

Here is an update on the campaign projects and finances:

- New church roof – completed
 - Original bid: \$268,000.
 - Actual expenses: \$272,455.
- New church boiler and basement HVAC – completed
 - Original bid: \$200,000.
 - Actual expenses: \$177,282.
- Brick repair and tuckpointing – north side completed, waiting to begin next phase
 - Original bid: \$286,076.
 - Spent so far: \$241,937.
 - Revised estimate for the rest of the church: \$161,920.
- Church bathroom remodel – nearly completed
 - Original bid: \$401,088.
 - Actual expenses so far: \$83,114.
- Rectory windows and doors – first 2 windows have been replaced, waiting to begin next phase
 - Original bid: \$98,000.
 - Spent so far: \$6,028.
- New storage building – not yet begun
 - Original bid: \$77,000.
- Church mini-splits – not yet begun
 - Original bid: \$90,000.
- Church parking lot – not yet begun
 - Original bid: \$21,000.

Our campaign goal is: \$1,441,000.

Donations received and pledged: \$1,358,110.

Amount short of goal: \$82,890.

In our weekly bulletin we have been keeping track of how many parishioners have donated to the campaign and what percentage of parishioners have donated. I'd like to update this number a little bit, and here's why: Last year, we cleaned up our parishioner database to remove anyone who was no longer active in the parish. This removed about 100 households from our list who were no longer active. Additionally, since our campaign started two years ago, we have had several new families join the parish. So the number of registered households keeps changing. Thus, I'd like to update the percentage of parishioners who have donated to reflect the current number of households on our books.

The current percentage of active families who have donated to the campaign is about 58%. This means we still have many active families who have not yet contributed. I ask that all families (longtime or new!) please make a gift to the campaign to do your part in helping repair our parish and make sure it will be here for many more generations to come.

As a final note, we are very close to putting the final touches on the church basement bathroom project, and will be opening them up for use very soon!

You are in my daily prayers.
