

*Blessed are you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth;
you have revealed to little ones the mysteries of the kingdom.*

Lenten Disciplines

During Lent, it is common to give up something like chocolate. I am very much in favor of this kind of discipline because by denying ourselves we grow in self-control and also can offer that sacrifice up to God.

But I don't simply encourage giving something up for Lent, I also encourage taking on additional prayer and other spiritual practices for Lent.

Connected with this, I would like to draw your attention to a wonderful program called Exodus 90. Exodus 90 is a 90-day spiritual exercise program, especially designed for men, which incorporates life-disciplines and prayer into a powerful journey of faith and formation. Exodus 90 is best practiced with a group of others for 90 days, but even if you don't commit to 90 days, I would like to recommend you incorporate some of these practices into your personal discipline for Lent this year.

Based on the Exodus 90 disciplines, here are some ideas I would encourage you to consider this Lent:

Prayer

- Make a daily holy hour, or at least once a week.
- Attend daily Mass, or at least one daily Mass a week.
- Read the daily Mass readings at home.
- Pray the Stations of the Cross daily, or at least attend Stations on Fridays at church.
- Pray the Rosary daily.
- Go to confession more than once during Lent.

Asceticism

- Take short, cold showers.
- Practice regular, intense exercise.
- Get a full night's sleep (at least seven hours is recommended).
- Wake up on first alarm and not hit snooze.
- Abstain from alcohol.
- Abstain from desserts and sweets.
- Abstain from eating between meals.
- Abstain from soda or sweet drinks (white milk, black coffee, and plain tea are permissible).
- Abstain from television, movies, or televised sports.
- Abstain from video games.
- Abstain from non-essential material purchases.
- Only listen to music that lifts the soul to God.
- Only use the computer for work, school, or essential tasks.
- Only use mobile devices for essential communications; cut out non-essential texting, app, and internet use.
- Take Fridays as days of fasting. (Abstain from meat and only eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.)

These practices can be pretty difficult, but are very powerful ways to grow in faith and perseverance, and to make a sacrificial gift of ourselves to God. I encourage you to choose one or more of them as a special Lenten penance to do this year.

You are in my daily prayers.




