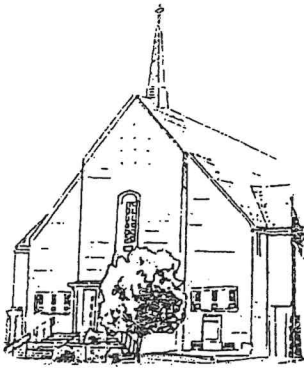

The Separation of Church and State

Everyone has heard of the term “*the separation of Church and State*”. But where does that idea come from, and what role does it officially play in our country?

This phrase appears nowhere in the Declaration of Independence, or the Constitution, or the Bill of Rights. In fact, it appears in no official document of our country.

The phrase comes from a letter written in 1802 by President Thomas Jefferson to the Danbury Baptist Association assuring them that the government would never interfere in religious expression. He wrote:

“Believing with you that religion is a matter which lies solely between man and his God, ... I contemplate with sovereign reverence that act of the whole American people which declared that their legislature should ‘make no law respecting an establishment of religion or prohibiting the free exercise thereof,’ thus building a wall of separation between Church and State.”

Thus, the “separation of Church and State” is intended to protect religion, not ban it from public life. In that paragraph, Jefferson quoted the First Amendment of the Constitution which declares:

“Congress shall make no law respecting the establishment of religion or prohibiting the free exercise thereof.”

The reason for the First Amendment’s reference to religion was twofold: To ensure that there was not a national religion endorsed by the government (such as Anglicanism in England, which is the official state-sponsored religion), and to ensure that people would be free to practice their religion.

The First Amendment was never intended to remove religion from public life! But rather to ensure that people would be free to practice their religion. Somehow we have now been convinced that it is the other way around – that the First Amendment somehow bans religious practice in public – whereas its very purpose is to protect the practice of religion.

Indeed, as John Adams famously said:

“We have no government armed with power capable of contending with human passions unbridled by morality and religion. ... Our Constitution was made only for a moral and religious people. It is wholly inadequate to the government of any other.”

There is a wonderful little book by David Barton called *Separation of Church and State – What the founders meant*. Here is a good quote from the book:

A conversation I once had with a U.S. Congressman (who is also an accomplished attorney) illustrates how deeply this non-constitutional phrase has been infused in our constitutional thinking. ...

Pastor's column continued...

As we were discussing the importance of basic religious values and teachings to public behavior and society in general, he lamented, "We know these values are important; it's unfortunate we can't do anything to promote them." Surprised I queried, "Why not?" He replied, "We just can't." "I persisted, "Why not?" He answered, "Because of 'Separation of church and state.'" I responded, "'Separation of church and state'? What about it?" He replied, "It's in the Constitution – the Constitution won't permit us to have religious values in public arenas." I returned, "That phrase is not in the Constitution!" "Forcefully he countered, "Yes it is!" "No it's not." "Yes it is." We went back and forth. I finally gave him a copy of the Constitution and asked, "Would you please find that phrase for me?" He replied triumphantly, "I'd be happy to!" He immediately turned to the First Amendment, read it – and became very embarrassed. He said, "I can't believe this! In law school they always taught us that's what the First Amendment said!" Amazed, I asked, "You've never read the Constitution for yourself?" He replied, "We were never required to read it in law school."

The fact is, we need God and religion and morality in our country. Let us not bow to the idea that religion should have no part in public life, but rather, continue to boldly live our right for the "free exercise thereof".
