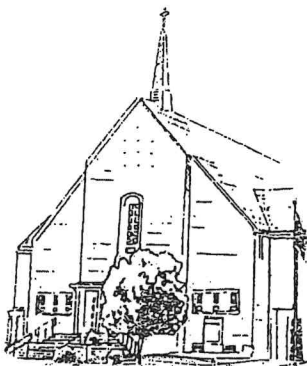

How to offer each decade of the Rosary – The Sorrowful Mysteries

I recently read a great book by St. Louis de Montfort called *The Secret of the Rosary*, which is a series of meditations and stories about how powerful the rosary is. There is also a section in the book about how to think about and offer each decade of the rosary. I'd like to share this part for your reflection and use.

Simply pray these short prayers before the appropriate decade of the rosary that you are saying, and try to keep your mind and heart focused on this intention for the entire decade.

The Sorrowful Mysteries

First Decade (The Agony in the Garden) – We offer you, O Lord Jesus, this decade in honor of your mortal agony in the Garden of Olives and we ask of you, through this mystery and through the intercession of your Blessed Mother, perfect sorrow for our sins and the virtue of perfect obedience to your Holy Will.

Second Decade (The Scourging at the Pillar) – We offer you, O Lord Jesus, this decade in honor of your bloody scourging and we ask of you, through this mystery and through the intercession of your Blessed Mother, the grace to mortify our senses perfectly.

Third Decade (The Crowning with Thorns) – We offer you, O Lord Jesus, this decade in honor of your cruel crowning with thorns, and we ask of you, through this mystery and through the intercession of your Blessed Mother, a great contempt of the world.

Fourth Decade (The Carrying of the Cross) – We offer you, O Lord Jesus, this decade in honor of you carrying your cross and we ask of you, through this mystery and through the intercession of your Blessed Mother, to give us great patience in carrying our cross in your footsteps every day of our life.

Fifth Decade (The Crucifixion) – We offer you, O Lord Jesus, this decade in honor of your crucifixion on Mount Calvary, and we ask of you, through this mystery and through the intercession of your Blessed Mother, a great horror of sin, a love of the Cross and the grace of a holy death for us and for those who are now in their last agony.

Closing prayer:

We beseech you, dear Lord Jesus, by the mysteries of your life, death and passion by your glory and by the merits of your Blessed Mother, to convert sinners and help the dying, to deliver the Holy Souls from purgatory and to give us all your grace so that we may live well and die well—and please give us the Light of your glory later on so that we may see you face to face and love you for all eternity. Amen.

Next week I will share the meditations for the Glorious Mysteries.

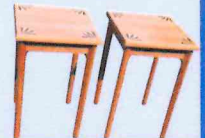
