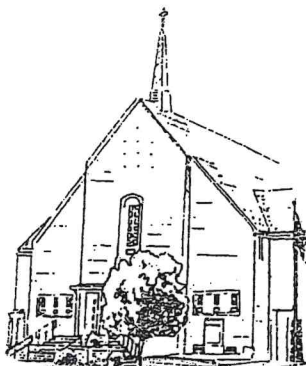

Beatification of Archbishop Fulton Sheen

On Thursday, September 24th, Archbishop Fulton Sheen will be beatified. This is the final step before someone is "canonized" as a saint.

Fulton J. Sheen was born on May 8, 1895, in El Paso, Illinois. He was ordained a priest in 1919, and a bishop in 1951.

He served as a parish priest and a teacher of theology and philosophy. But Archbishop Fulton Sheen is most known for his radio and TV shows – "The Catholic Hour", "Life is Worth Living", and "The Fulton Sheen Program".

It is so impressive that a Catholic bishop came to have one of the most popular TV shows of his day. He won an Emmy award for his television show, and was featured on the front of Time magazine due to his popularity.

Pope Saint John Paul II said to him shortly before his death: "You have written and spoken well of the Lord Jesus. You are a loyal son of the Church."

He died on December 9, 1979, at the age of 84.

We also have a very special connection to Archbishop Fulton Sheen in our Archdiocese, since he studied at the Saint Paul Seminary from 1917 to 1919.

Here is a great story from The Catholic Spirit:

According to accounts published over the years in The Catholic Bulletin, the predecessor to today's The Catholic Spirit, the official newspaper of the archdiocese, Archbishop Sheen once wanted to pray before the Blessed Sacrament but found the seminary's main chapel locked. Rather than let the locked doors end his prayer, he walked back and forth outside and made a promise to God: if given the grace of ordination, he would make a Holy Hour before the Blessed Sacrament every day for the rest of his life in thanksgiving — a promise he kept until his death. While Archbishop Sheen's path to the priesthood had included studies at Spalding Institute and St. Viator College in Illinois before St. Paul, it was here that his daily Eucharistic devotion took hold, and more than six decades later he would still be talking about its spiritual importance.

Archbishop Hebda said he sees that Eucharistic foundation as central to understanding Archbishop Sheen's life and ministry. "While a brilliant orator and thinker, Archbishop Sheen realized that it was our Eucharistic Lord who was the source of all his gifts," Archbishop Hebda said. "I believe that his advocacy of the daily hour has had a huge impact on the priests of our nation, and certainly on the priests and seminarians of this Archdiocese."

If you are not familiar with the work of Archbishop Fulton Sheen, I encourage you to look up some videos of his online. He is an excellent speaker and teacher, and has inspired millions to love and live their faith.

It is a great joy to celebrate the beatification of another American. I pray that through his books and video recordings he will continue to teach and inspire me and all American Catholics in living their faith.

I encourage you to ask soon-to-be Blessed Fulton Sheen for his heavenly intercession.

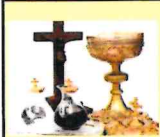
